Goetta load of this!

Members and friends of the Ohio Valley Section IFT gathered at the Rhinegeist Brewery in the historic neighborhood of Cincinnati lovingly referred to as Over-the-Rhine on September 25th. The location was the perfect backdrop for the discussion of the day, the delectable Cincinnati speciality best known as goetta. Since its arrival with nineteenth-century Germanic immigrants, this humble dish has evolved from peasant staple to ubiquitous delicacy. Food etymologist and "Goettevangelist" Dann Woellert walked attendees through a fascinating tale of goetta's history in the city that made it regionally famous.
